Be Alive: Breathe Life Upon the Dry Bones

Fzekiel 37:1-10

hirty years ago, like Ezekiel was led into the valley of dry bones, God led me into the field of North Korean defectors. Seeing the people struggling to survive amid hunger and fear, and faces frozen by suspicion and distrust, the vision God had given me became even clearer: "Prepare those who will bring the Gospel to North Korea." That calling was not just a call to help, but to embrace the wounds and emptiness of the deepest kind. That was the beginning of my journey with the North Korean students. Children marked by malnutrition, disease, lies, and violence; they were, in every sense, like dry bones.

After COVID-19, the number of children born to North Korean defectors in China who entered South Korea increased noticeably. These children, unfamiliar with both the language and emotions of Korea, carried deep scars from never feeling loved. Their mothers had endured human trafficking and forced marriages for the sake of survival, and that suffering passed down scars in different forms to their children. In the midst of this heartbreaking reality, I once again realized how desperate the Gospel is needed.

The Lord taught me that life itself is Jesus Christ, and I made a resolution: "Proclaim the Word to the children. Even if they fall asleep during worship, keep declaring the Gospel." Thus, our school's identity was built upon bearing witness to Jesus Christ, the Life. The teachers, both in the classrooms and in the dormitories where they live with the students, share the Gospel first through their lives before their words — living out the labor of love.

The fruits of this labor are unmistakable. Students who were once like dry bones now cry out to God as 'Abba, Father,' praying tearfully for the land of North Korea. One graduate confessed, "I will go and share the Jesus I met in North Korea." Is this not the fulfillment of Ezekiel 37? The vision of the dry bones receiving breath and rising as a "vast army" has become reality before our eyes.

God will surely accomplish the unification of Korea through the Gospel. In North Korea where we often forget to look — 26 million souls are still dying without the Gospel and without freedom. There must be those who prophesy: "Come, breath, from the four winds, and breathe into these slain, that they may live." I believe that God will fulfill His work through a person. Gospel unification is not an option but a calling, and it is a promise that God Himself will bring to completion.

"Lord, grant the people of North Korea the freedom to praise You openly. Deliver the captives swiftly. We believe that You, the living God who is here among us, will raise us and them up together as a mighty army. In the name of Jesus Christ we pray. Amen."

This past July, the 15th English Unification Camp (EUC) was held at the Korean Peninsula Unification Future Center and ended with an overflow of blessings, through much prayer and dedicated service. Around 300 participants, including the next generation from both South and North backgrounds and staff members from 32 different countries, gathered together for five days and four nights of passionate worship and rich fellowship—a time more fervent than the midsummer heat itself.





This year's camp was held under the theme "OUTSHINE," inspired by the message of Matthew 5:14.

"JESUS THE LIGHT," the true Light who guides us and gives life in the midst of darkness;

"WE THE LIGHT," those who reflect His light to brighten the world; and

"GLORY TO GOD," lives that shine for His glory—

Students joined the camp for various reasons — to improve their English, to experience worship and fellowship — yet through small groups where they met students from North Korean backgrounds, as well as through the unification seminars and workshops, they came to understand God's heart for the people of North Korea more deeply. Each year, the English Unification Camp (EUC) continues to grow richer and deeper in God's grace. Even during preparations, we experienced God's clear guidance — applications filled up quickly, and there was a noticeable increase in returning participants who had been blessed in previous camps. We are especially thankful that the camp was completed safely to the very end. We believe that through EUC, the next generation — who will live in the era of unification — is being raised up to see North Korea through God's eyes and to prepare as His people for that day. All glory be to God, and we ask for your continued prayers for EUC26, which will be held next July.



No Life Without Grace

At Heavenly Dream School, I serve in several areas. First, I am responsible for the school's accounts. Although I majored in mathematics and enjoy working with numbers, the numbers in accounting feel quite different, and at times, the responsibility can be overwhelming. Still, I am able to serve with gratitude because I am certain that this is the position God has entrusted to me. There is a sense of joy in knowing that I am part of the Lord's work, and a guiet satisfaction in supporting the overall ministry of the school. Second, I teach physical education classes. Through futsal, badminton, and walks, I have precious opportunities to spend time with many of our students. I have loved sports since I was young, and being able to exercise

together with the students truly makes me happy. I cherish the moments when we go on walks and take in the beauty of nature, and share small, heartfelt conversations. Lastly, I serve in the dorms. I currently live with four students. At first, I was worried about whether I could get along well with children who grew up in such different environments, but my concerns didn't last long. As we worshiped together and shared delicious meals, we quickly became close. There are times when difficult situations arise, I ask for His love and remind myself, "When God looks at me, I'm no different from these children." By His grace, I can faithfully carry out the calling He has given me.

Although my time at Heavenly Dream has not been long, it is such a great joy to be in this place so dearly loved by God. I used to excitedly read the school newsletter from afar, and now, as a Heavenly Dream teacher, the thought of my own writing being published makes me nervous.

Draw Near to the Lord

I'm reminded of the days in college when I prayed with all my heart. Every night at 9 p.m., I gathered with friends of faith to worship and pray, and met God personally. As my relationship with the Lord deepened, a longing grew within me — a desire to be used by Him. One day, I attended a Daniel Prayer Meeting, where a North Korean human rights activist shared their testimony. They spoke about the hunger and pain of their days as a kkotjebi (a street orphan in North Korea), and how even now, people in the North are dying without ever hearing the Gospel. From that day on, I began to pray for North Korea. God poured into my heart a deep, grieving compassion for that land...

God's Calling


At the church I was serving at the time, I joyfully took part of a monthly prayer meeting a for Gospelcentered unification. During one of those gatherings, God gave me a vision — "I will use you as a vessel for Gospel unification." While praying before my teacher certification exam, God placed a strong burden on my heart for Heavenly Dream School, which I had first learned about through a Christian broadcasting program. I had never even met a North Korean defector before, so I didn't understand why God was giving me this calling — but I chose to trust His good and perfect plan. After two years of waiting and refining, God, in His faithfulness, opened the way for me to join Heavenly Dream School.











Voyager



in North Korea I was just an ordinary child. Every morning, I went to school, and at lunchtime, I played with my friends on the playground. Sitting at a desk for long hours was difficult, but running, playing soccer, and laughing until I was out of breath were my greatest joys. Back then, I was too young to know what the world beyond the border was like — how wide, how different it could be. I simply accepted the rules and patterns of life given to me in North Korea, believing that was all there was to the world. One day, I sensed even with my young heart, that something serious was happening from the heavy expressions on my parents' faces. When

I was thirteen years old, my younger sibling and I followed our parents on an escape from North Korea, without any explanation. I still remember my father's words vividly as we reached the Amnok River (Yalu River): "No matter how cold the water is, you must not make a sound." The moment my feet touched the icy water, my body flinched, but I clenched my teeth and endured in silence. After a long journey through China, Vietnam, and Laos, we finally boarded a plane bound for South Korea. Instead of fear, my heart was filled with excitement and hope. Looking out the window, the white clouds and the blue sky felt like a door opening into a new world.



in South Korea Contrary to my expectations, life in South Korea was a continual process of challenge and perseverance. After entering elementary school, I faced many difficulties adjusting to the unfamiliar environment. Because I was from North Korea, I was sometimes teased, and in the curious yet cold gazes directed at me, I felt deep wounds forming in my heart. I was filled with the thought that everyone must hate me.

But when I entered Heavenly Dream School as a middle school student, things began to change. There were many other students who had also come from North Korea, and that helped me adjust with a sense of stability and belonging. I attended school diligently for six years — from my first year of middle school through my senior year of high school. One memory that stands out is the English Unification Camp (EUC). Though I was excited about the camp, I was also anxious — "Will I be able to get along with others?" — and felt the burden

of having to communicate in English. As I feared, the camp ended without me having had a proper conversation with my teammates. That experience became the starting point of my English journey. I signed up for after-school tutoring, began learning basic vocabulary, and gradually gained confidence through steady effort. Before long, I was even able to have simple conversations with foreign volunteers who came to the school.

In 2023, I returned to the camp as a Heavenly Dream School graduate. My English wasn't perfect, but this time, I could speak comfortably with the international participants. Heavenly Dream School had always provided an environment that helped me grow. The teachers saw my drawings and encouraged me, and even chose my design for a school postcard. And even when I acted out at times, they embraced me with love and patience. Through these experiences, the wounds I carried from my past slowly began to heal.

in New Zealand I was selected as one of the third group of Heavenly Dream School students to study abroad in New Zealand, and I began my life in Auckland this past August. I'm studying English diligently at a language institute and continuing to grow in faith within a healthy church community. Once, I couldn't even freely leave my own neighborhood — but now, I find myself in a much wider world, meeting new people, communicating in English, and experiencing many different cultures. I am deeply grateful for this precious opportunity to broaden my horizons through the New Zealand language program. God's plan for my life is closely bound to the school's mission. The school sees us as future leaders of the unified Korea and helps us grow into that calling. When that day comes, I hope to return to North Korea and use design as a tool to introduce South Korean society to its people and help them enjoy the same freedom I have experienced. Through my artwork, I want to capture the freedom, growth, and possibility I've found here - breaking down prejudices about South Korea and planting in their hearts a dream for change. I believe that sometimes, the visual language of art can speak more deeply than words. Until that day arrives, I will keep learning, growing, and striving to become a person of depth. I sincerely hope that the path I have walked and the one I will continue to walk - will become a source of courage and hope for others.

Lastly, I ask for your prayers that I may live safely and healthily here in New Zealand, and that in the stillness, I may draw closer to God.
